UPLB toward a future-proof university

The university has reached another milestone as it conducted the first UPLB-Alumni-Industry Summit on November 6, 2021 at the REDREC Auditorium.

"Please join us in being a part of the University and let us manifest our relevance to our Alma Mater," encouraged Dr. Cristino M. Collado, Vice President of UPLB Alumni Association (UPLBAA) in his welcome remarks. "Deep in your heart, wherever you are, the UPLB spirit is always alive and present in our consciousness. Together we can do a lot," he exhorted.

Atty. Danilo L. Concepcion, UP President, graced the formalization of the strategic alliance among the different stakeholders to attain sustainability in resources and operations as a response to the fourth industrial revolution. He shared his insights on the proposed synergy of the academe, alumni, and industry partnership. Despite the disruptions brought by the pandemic, President Concepcion recognized the passion of UPLB's constituents in continuously performing the mandate of public service through teaching and research and by providing quality education to produce skilled students and graduates.

"Respect, responsibility, honor, excellence, inclusivity, social responsibility, accessibility,

innovativeness, and compassion - these are the values we uphold in everything we do," said President Concepcion.

Furthermore, he highlighted the importance of the alumni as a rich source of support and expertise to enhance productivity and efficiency in the agriculture, industry, and service sectors; develop and promote research and development; and support efforts of Filipino scientists, engineers, and alumni experts needed to hasten the country's socio-economic development and improve quality of lives.

UPLB Chancellor Jose V. Camacho, Jr. provided updates during his first year of leadership as well as shared current initiatives for future proofing UPLB.

"To achieve this, we must sustain UPLB's relevance by developing methods, approaches, and frameworks to minimize the cost and impacts of shocks and future events; and by honing leaders committed to knowledge creation, innovation and cutting-edge research, and public service," he emphasized.

He encouraged active engagement from the different sectors to establish dynamic, responsive, and symbiotic relationships to better understand


what the industry needs in terms of graduate skills, competencies, and know-how.

In addition, Chancellor Camacho presented plans on enhancing the academic curricula to fit the new and next normal. He highlighted the significant contributions of UPLBAA in various events; in infrastructure, equipment, and facilities development; in sponsorship, grants, student support services, student learning assistance, relief programs, internship placement and employment, and sharing of expertise and knowledge.

Included in his report are the proposed establishment of the UPLB Center for Teaching and Learning Excellence (CATL) as a support unit to strengthen local and private linkages; the UPLB

Enterprise Architecture Plan to harmonize and level up information systems and databases; the UPLB AGORA (Accelerating Growth through One Research in Action) to transcend the traditional ways of thinking and research practices of the University; and the UPLB Extension Agenda anchored on sustainable development goals; and marketing and commercialization of products and technologies. He also annoounced that "The UPLB Agro-Industrial Park and the UPLB Information Technology Park at our special economic zone will soon rise."

As part of the morning session, Dr. Romel M. Carlos, director of the UPLB Technology Transfer and Business Development Office (TTBDO), explained the strategic goals on technology

transfer, business development, and inter/multidisciplinary initiatives to build a collaborative culture of innovation and entrepreneurship in Academe-Alumni-Industry-Government engagements. On the other hand, Dr. Rico C. Ancog, dean of the School of Environmental Science and Management (SESAM), discussed the four pillars of UPLB AGORA: food security and sovereignty; resilience and sustainability; future cities; and one health.

Dr. Geronimo M. Collado, first UPLB vice chancellor for Planning and Development; Dr. Manuel L. Logroño, head of Asia-Pacific (APAC) Field Crops Seeds Development; and Dr. Weerapon Thongma, president of UPLBAA Thailand Chapter and Asian Association of Agricultural Colleges and Universities, shared their knowledge and experiences on investing for human capital toward leadership in the industry. They stressed that technical, communication,

personal, and interpersonal skills, and entrepreneurial mindset are essential in keeping pace with the workforce of the future and become industry-ready.

Lastly, a forum exploring a framework for collaboration of the key players featured distinguished speakers from local government units, international development communities, and private sectors.

The Institute of Plant Breeding (IPB) under CAFS is one of the partners in future proofing the University. The institute joined the CAFS Extension Summit with the theme "CAFS Responding to Disruptive Challenges Through Unified and Harmonized Extension and Advisory Services" and the CAFS Research Summit in November 2021. IPB and CAFS are active partners in achieving UPLB's vision.

UPLB alumnus and team win the UN Best Small Business 2021

The Varacco Inc., a company from the Philippines, is recognized as one of the winners for the Best Small Business: "Good Food for All" competition in 2021 from 2,000 entrants around the world.

Ariestelo Asilo (BS Nutrition 2007) jumped with joy and excitement when he received this good news. Aries, a UPLB Alumnus and native of Batangas, pioneered Nutripreneurship, short for Nutrition and Entrepreneurship, through coffee production and research. He is the chief operating officer (COO) and co-founder of Varacco Inc. with CEO Kathleen Manto, as his co-founder. It is an early present for the partners when they received the award during the first anniversary of Timplado, their registered café restaurant.

All the dreams that he is fulfilling now began with a question, "10 years from now, what do you like to do?" Aries was still a student when this was asked by his professor. This question made him think. He realized that within that span of time, he wanted to own a business.

Armed with knowledge, skills, and network, he opened his first business venture, an agricultural company, in 2013. His first attempt was unsuccessful, but that did not hinder him from trying again. He opened another business, an accounting company helping small businesses to organize their systems. For two years, he diligently worked as operations head of the company. However, he got burned out and decided to close it down just like his first company.



Aries decided to pursue a master's degree in business management at the University of the Philippines through the US Peace Corps Alumni Foundation for Philippine Development. This is the same scholarship that assisted him to finish his BS Nutrition in 2007. The schooling exposed him to various trainings, seminars, and conferences, which widened his business network, management experiences, and research exposure.

In 2018, Aries was introduced by a common friend to Kathleen "Kat" Manto. He saw Kat with a group of mothers making coffee as a small business. That time, he recalled that in Lobo Batangas, many coffee beans remain unharvested or scattered under the trees and were consumed

only when needed. The idea struck him that the coffee beans could be used commercially.

He and Kat decided to be business partners and started Varacco Inc. Aries' ambition of owning a coffee company became possible. Kat was more focused on the coffee products, and it was her idea to develop a dip coffee product. Aries for his part, was interested in the coffee business development and research.

Aries' goal was to attain a sustainable food service system by progressive value addition leading to increased productivity, profitability, and product quality. With this passion, he shared his innovative model on Nutripreneurship by speaking at national and international conferences. He tapped partners from different universities. On top of that, he has one patent and five trademarks to his name.

With these achievements, Aries was recognized as 2020 UPLB Distinguished Alumnus for Nutrition Entrepreneurship and Community Nutrition. In 2021, Aries also won a grant from ACDI-VOCA funded by the USDA for his coffee research.

Learning from the Mentors

Before he started the business in 2012, he consulted three distinguished men he considered as mentors, namely: Dr. Romulo Davide, Mr. Antonio "Tony" Meloto, and Dr. Aries Alip.

These three mentors helped him visualize the path to achieve his goals. He wanted to replicate Dr. Davide's national program called "Farmers' Scientists Training Program" (FSTP) by focusing on coffee and calling it, "Coffee-based Farming and Entrepreneurship Engagement (COFFEE) Program. In the future, he also wanted to have his own rural bank just like Dr. Alip's CARD bank. t like Mr. Meloto who owns a farm, Aries, wanted

And like Mr. Meloto who owns a farm, Aries, likewise wanted to have his own coffee farm. His engagements with these mentors guided him in his journey o be a successful entrepreneur and public servant.

Creating the Brand

The partners, Aries and Kat, started Varacco Inc. in 2018. The company focused on selling coffee. Though they faced many challenges such as the pandemic in 2020, they pushed through with the launching of Timplado in July 2020. They carefully strategized before they started launching digitally. They celebrated their first anniversary last July 31, 2021.

Their coffee is branded as Circa 1740 because that is the year when the Spaniards brought coffee to Lipa. The Gobernadorcillo that time ordered the mass production of coffee. Lipa became affluent with the production of coffee.

"We want to give honor to our heritage and culture in Lipa," Aries explained.

Timplado was coined by one of their partners. It should have been the name of their coffee because it is already mixed or "timplado". But the partners thought it would be better to use it for the store's name because it is very Filipino. Now, Timplado is becoming popular not only in Batangas but also in nearby provinces. And the income improved as well as their business.

Seizing the Opportunity

In 2020, Aries was awarded as a fellow of the Young Southeast Asian Leader Initiative (YSEALI) Professional Fellows Program for Economic Empowerment, a of program Fullbright, This USA. award opened a lot of doors for competitions, grants, and opportunities.

Since one of the Aries recalled. that Aries things wanted to do was conducted research, he coffee research with his team. His technical coordinator urged him to apply for the United Nations (UN) Best Small Business competition. Upon reflection, Aries felt that their company stood a good chance, so he and his team prepared all the needed documents to beat the deadline.

Another question enabled him to share their advocacy and to be heard by the UN. The

competition assessed the applicants based on their business' contribution for a healthier, more sustainable, and equitable food for their communities; their vision's strength; and their impact.

Aries' team prayed hard to win. And God answered their prayers. Out of 2,000 hopefuls, they placed in the top 150 and became one of the semi-finalists. Their journey didn't end there. As a semi-finalist, they were required to prepare a 2-minute video to answer (without editing) all the UN's questions. Number of Graduates by Degree




Top 3 fields based on the number of graduates




